O'KEEFFE Pre-Law Studies

AT THE KING'S ACADEMY SCHOLARSHIPS PROGRAM

The O'Keeffe Pre-Law Studies program at The King's Academy offers scholarships to encourage quality students to consider a future in legal studies by enrolling in one or all of TKA's pre-law courses.

The program will provide scholarships from a pool of up to \$50,000 per year to new or current 9th-12th grade TKA full-time domestic students who have applied and been tested for admission or are currently enrolled in The King's Academy.

REQUIREMENTS FOR APPLICATION:

- Have a 3.5 or higher unweighted cumulative GPA
- Have a 3.75 unweighted GPA in the pre-law program (if pre-law courses have been taken thus far)
- Display exemplary conduct as befits a position of student leadership

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICATION:

Student must submit the following 3 items to Jane Winters, Assistant to the Headmaster by **April 2nd at 12:00 noon:**

- An application form; forms are available through Admissions, Development, and Mrs. Brown or Mrs. Sherman
- 2. A 3-4 page essay in MLA format on prompt
- **3. One letter of recommendation** provided in hard copy, preferably in a sealed envelope from the teacher

Family must apply for FAST by April 2, 2019 by the end of the business day.

Finalists will be invited to interview with the selection committee.

2019-20 ESSAY PROMPT:

Essay must be 3-4 pages typed double spaced: "Are the branches of federal government acting in accordance with the roles assigned by the U.S. Constitution?" Why or why not?

EXPECTATIONS OF RECIPIENTS MAY INCLUDE:

- Assist in leading the First Monday tradition
- Assist with the Explore elementary Mock Trial
- Act as an ambassador for the O'Keeffe Pre-Law Program at law-related events (typically 2-3 per year)
- Participate in the Mock Trial Team and/or Club
- Assist with annual reporting to program donors about experiences in the program each year

INFORMATION ABOUT SCHOLARSHIPS

- Scholarship awards are merit-based.
- Scholarship awards are applied to TKA tuition; there is no additional cost for the pre-law program.
