


#### O'Keeffe Speaker Series to Feature Jay Sekulow

### Dr. William Lile Shares Sanctity of Life

MS/HS students attended a special assembly today on "The Miracle of Life" led by Dr. William Lile. Also known as the Prolifedoc, Dr. Lile is a a board certified OB/GYN who has practiced medicine in both Florida and Alabama as well as serving as an instructor at the University of Florida and Florida State University. In 1999 he and a partner bought out the practice of the largest provider of abortion services in Pensacola and put an immediate stop to abortion procedures and referrals at the clinic. In addition to his work in the medical field, Dr. Lile speaks extensively in defense of the value of life from scientific, legal, and scriptural grounds.
